

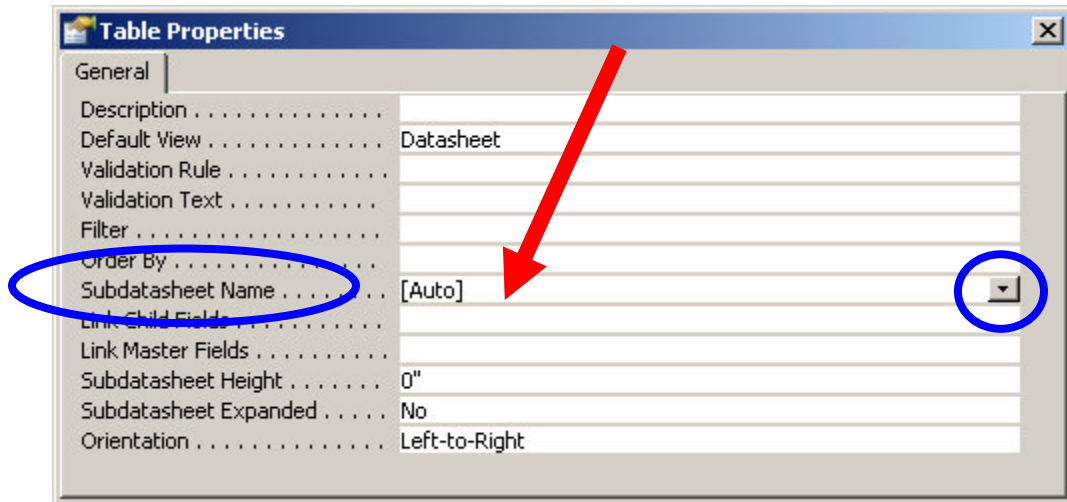
Set a Table's Subdatasheet Name Property to [None]

in your Access database*

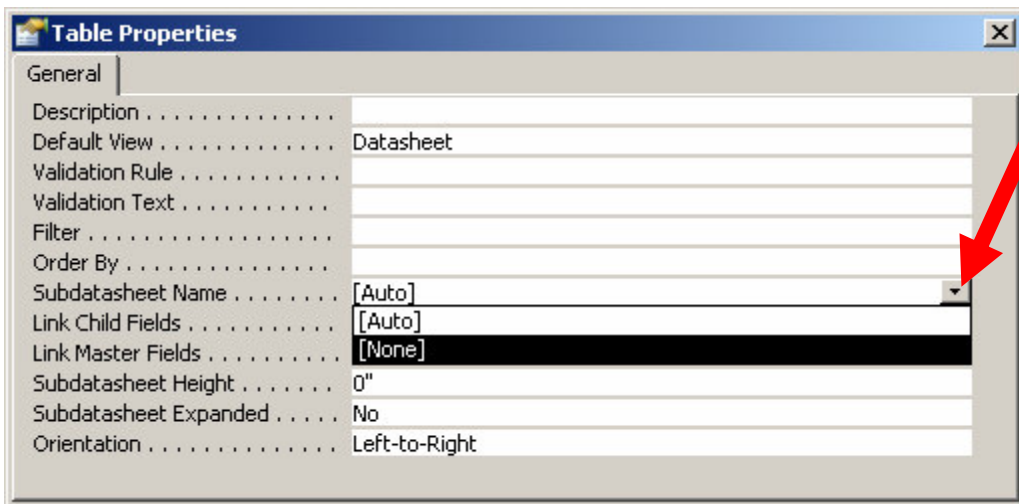

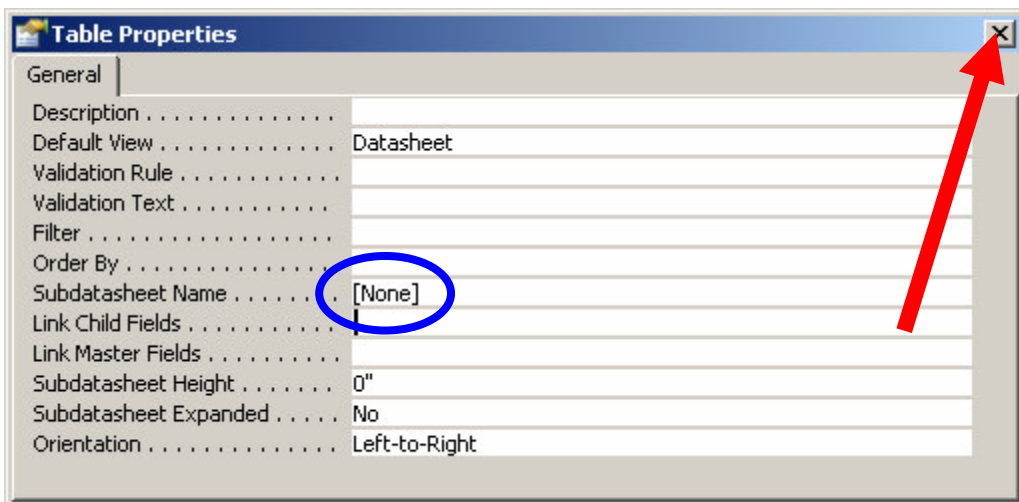
In the **Table Properties** dialog box, click the **Subdatasheet Name** line (where it says [Auto]), and you'll see a "droplist" arrow.



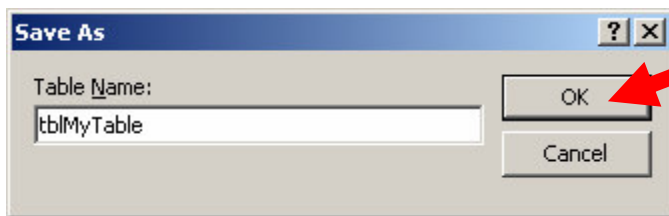
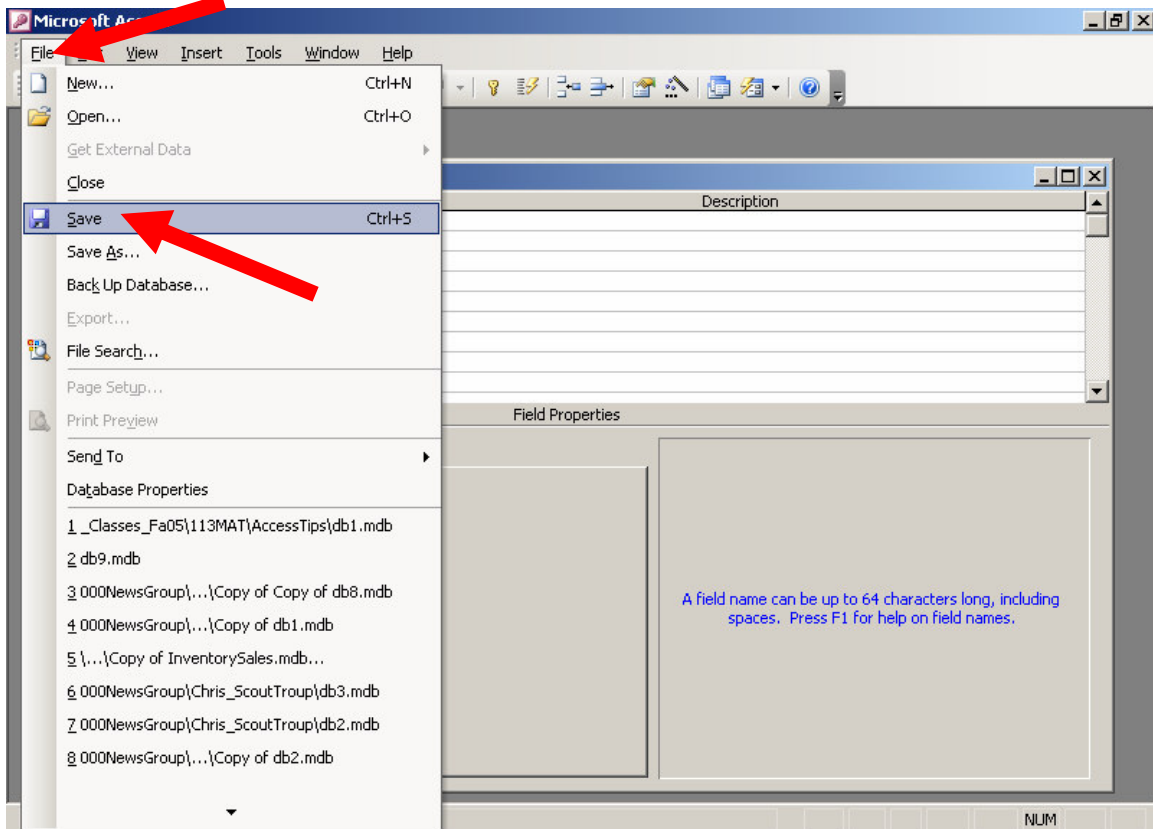
Click the arrow, and select **[None]** from the droplist.



Close the **Table Properties** dialog box.



Create at least one field in the table, and then save the table.



Note: you can set the **Subdatasheet Name** property in an existing table, also. Just follow the same steps. (If there are other tables in the database, they will be listed in the droplist; just ignore them, and choose **[None]** from the list.)
