The **CONFAB** is the annual "business meeting" of New Jersey Traffic Handlers; it's a time to get together and meet the "iron men and women" behind the keys and mikes; and an opportunity to congratulate the winners of the prestigious NJ Traffic Handler memorial awards which honor the memories of W2SWE, W2UEZ, and K2SE. Directions to *The College formerly known as Trenton State* are below. Talk-in is on the W2ZQ West Trenton repeater 146.67 (-600) and PL is 131.8 if needed.

There WILL be a lunch at Ground Round after the meeting. Hope to see you there.

### DIRECTIONS FROM NORTH JERSEY

1. Take Route 1 South, or Route 206 South, to I-95 South (toward Pennsylvania).
2. Leave I-95 at Exit 4 for Route 31. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left at the light.
3. Follow Route 31 South about 1.5 miles to the 2nd traffic light and the college entrance is on the left. Turn left into the college; the large building immediately in front of you is Armstrong Hall. Bear to the right, then make the first quick left into Parking Lot #20, upper level. The meeting should be in Armstrong Hall in the same room as last year (but be prepared for last minute changes).

OR

Take Route 202 South to Route 31 South, and continue on Route 31 past I-95 as above.

OR

Take the NJ Turnpike to Exit 7A. Then take I-195 West (Trenton) about 6 miles to I-295 North (Princeton, Exit 60-B). Follow I-295 north as it changes into I-95 and look for Exit 4 as above (total of 12 miles from Interchange 60).

Take I-295 North until it becomes I-95, then look for Exit 4 and proceed as #2 above.

### DIRECTIONS FROM THE SHORE

Take I-195 West to its end, then take I-295 North (Princeton), and follow I-295 into I-95 and look for Exit 4 as in #2 above.

**Parking note:** We have no way to know which parking lots will be open. Lot 20 has an upper and lower level and last year only the upper level was open. If neither is open this time, try lot 14 across the roadway. In any case, enter the building from the rear or from the side by the lower parking level, whichever door is open, walk toward the front of the building, turn left at the last hallway, and go to the end. We shouldn't be hard to find, we make plenty of noise.
